Further to the notice that Seagreen Wind Energy Limited, registered under company registration 06873902 at No. 1 Forbury Place, 43 Forbury Road, Reading, United Kingdom RG1 3JH, has applied to the Scottish Ministers for:

- consents under section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989; and
- marine licences under section 20 of the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010 and section 65 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009.

to construct and operate the Seagreen Alpha Offshore Wind Farm and Seagreen Bravo Offshore Wind Farm located approximately 27km east of the Angus coastline with a total combined area of approximately 391km<sup>2</sup> (central latitude and longitude co-ordinates: Seagreen Alpha 56° 36' 39.672" N, 1° 49' 17.750" W; Seagreen Bravo 56° 34' 20.859" N, 1° 39' 31.587" W (WGS84)). These proposed developments are subject to environmental impact assessment ("EIA") under the above EIA Regulations.

Notice is hereby given that Seagreen Wind Energy Limited has submitted additional information relative to the above EIA applications to the Scottish Ministers. This includes information relating to ornithology, including the Seagreen Phase 1 Habitats Regulations Appraisal – Information to Inform Appropriate Assessment, as well as an updated EIA Report Ornithology Chapter and associated technical appendices. The Seagreen Alpha and Seagreen Bravo wind farms will comprise of up to 70 wind turbine generators ("WTG") in each but with a combined total of no more than 120 WTG between the two developments and with WTG at a maximum height of 280 metres above Lowest Astronomical Tide.

The Scottish Ministers may consider representations received after this date. Representations should be dated and should clearly state the name (in block capitals) and the full return email or postal address of those making representation.

Subsequent submission of additional information by Seagreen Wind Energy Limited to the Scottish Ministers will be publicised in a similar manner to this including publication on the above websites and further public notices. Representations relative to such additional information should be made on the same basis as detailed above.

Where the Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, the Scottish Ministers may cause a Public Local Inquiry (“PLI”) to be held.

Having considered the environmental information, in conjunction with any representations received, the Scottish Ministers may:

- Consent to the proposed developments, with or without conditions attached; or
- Reject the proposed developments.

**All previous representations received in relation to these developments will be considered.**

#### Fair Processing Notice

The Scottish Government’s Marine Scotland Licensing Operations Team (“MS-LOT”) determine applications for marine licences under the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010, the Marine and Coastal Act 2009 and section 36 consents under The Electricity Act 1989 (as amended). During the consultation process any person having an interest in the outcome of the application may make a representation to MS-LOT. The representation may contain personal information, for example a name or address. This representation will only be used for the purpose of determining an application and will be stored securely in the Scottish Government’s official corporate record. Representations will be shared with the applicant and/or agent acting on behalf of the applicant, any people or organisations that we consult in relation to the application, the Directorate of Planning and Environmental Appeals should the Scottish Ministers call a PLI and, where necessary, be published online, however personal information will be removed before sharing or publishing.
